



From the Reverend


I was quite certain that 2016 was going to be a great year. Maybe for some of you, it was. I am not at all sad to see this year end. My year was less than the great year I had planned. It was not all bad. A new Bible Study was started and I had the honor of baptizing Dakota DeFalco. I was finally Ordained on July 17th, but my dad was unable to be with us due to the multiple surgeries he had on his foot, and the subsequent amputation of a portion of his foot. I am grateful that I had a wonderful support group who stood in his place, and to all who came to celebrate the day with me. I am grateful to those of you who gave money so that I could go back to Indiana and visit him. It was so helpful for me to go back and see that my dad was okay. I attended the funeral of one of my former best friend's mother while there. I never imagined that I would be back in Indiana less than three months later for the funeral of my step-grandfather, George.

When I visited Indiana in July, the kids and I stayed at my Nana and George's house so as not to be a burden on my parents. George loved the kids; he and Aubrey had a special bond. George had taught Aubrey the proper way to pick strawberries from the garden, songs like, "In the Pines, in the Pines, where the sun never shines," and they loved to sit on the back porch and swing together. George and Nana loved each other more than words can adequately describe. George did everything for Nana as her mind continued to slip further and further away. It all seemed rather cruel that they went to bed one night, and he did not wake up the next morning, although I am grateful he did not suffer. I am thankful for the 13 years of happiness they had together. I am forever grateful that on my way out the door in July, I said, "George, thank you for loving and taking such good care of my Nana." Some days Nana forgets that George died, and when she is reminded that he is with Jesus, her grief nearly crushes her. Dementia is a savage beast.

I often remind myself of Jeremiah 29:11, "For I know the plans I have for you," declares the LORD, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future." Although, sometimes I find myself wondering just what God's grand plan is, and I know I must be patient. As we move into 2017, I believe God has some great things in store, and that while the year will be filled with highs and lows, it will be a good year. I will begin the three-year Nehemiah Leadership training in January. We will continue the Young Life youth group with other churches in the village, and in the schools, praying that God will give the youth a hunger to know the Lord and become connected with a church. In June, my home church from Indiana will be coming up for a visit, and bringing their fantastic hand bell choir to share with us. I am certain God has wonderful plans for us all, and we patiently continue forward trusting God to reveal those plans in HIS time.
