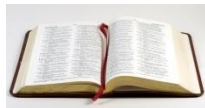
PRAYER FOR MARCH

Pastor's Corner



All any of us want is to be accepted and loved, right? Sometimes we try far too hard. That is my desire, anyway, to do well, to be pleasing to God. There are times that I am successful in my mission, and there are times that I fall flat on my face. What I appreciate most, is that we have a loving and forgiving God who understands that I will fail, at times and will love me anyway. There will be times that I will have to ask for God's forgiveness as well as the forgiveness of my congregation. Even though we will have those moments, don't give up on me, God has plans for us, we are far from finished.

There are some folks in our church family who have taken on a very important project, free community lunches. This was born out of an association meeting at Port Byron when we found out that the church had stepped out on faith and started free lunches with no start-up money.

There are many people who live in poverty, and struggle to pay bills and eat. Central Square only has one food pantry, at Divine Mercy Parish. I appreciate that we collect food once a month and contribute to the food bank, because before I accepted this call, my family was one that used our local food bank on a monthly basis. Even though I worked full-time as a nurse, it was not enough to sustain a family of five. While I was a full-time student and working as many hours as I could, we received food stamps, but the \$267 a month we were given did not stretch very far. I know what it is to come in after going to the grocery store and say "Okay, this is it. When this food is gone, we have nothing." "Let me tell you, it was wonderful to be able to buy Christmas presents and have food in the pantry this year.

I have said over and over that we need to reach beyond our own doors into the community, and I honestly believe that. I am so encouraged by the things we have begun to do and by the ministries that have restarted in order to reach out to others.

Let us be the hands and feet of Jesus. As you spend time in prayer, ask how you might be a part of the ministry here? What would God have you to do? It may not be something that we are doing now; it might be a future ministry. If God is speaking, please listen, and if you are willing, share it with me. I thank God for each and every one of you, and the ministry of this church.
