

Psalm 119: 2 reads, “Happy are those who keep his

how many of us can say that we seek God with our whole

of our being. That is a lot, I know, and yet that is exactly
what God desires, all of us.

We are in the Lenten season, a time where we are
supposed to give something up in order to help us think
about the sacrifice Jesus made. The problem becomes,
that often our focus becomes that habit we try to break
ourselves of or what we are sacrificing instead of THE
SACRIFICE. That is part of the reason I have never given up
coffee for Lent. I love coffee. But, I am not sure the world
can handle me without coffee. I am so afraid I would be
so focused on my lack of coffee that I would fail to reflect
on the sacrifice Christ made, at least in the way Christ
deserves; my whole heart.

What do you give your whole heart to in your life? It is a
difficult question to answer. Athletes often give all of
themselves to their sport. Not only do they have to
sacrifice their time for practice, missing family
celebrations and important events, but they also have to
focus on their nutrition. Their mental attitude is just as
important as their health. If one thing is off, then they
don’t perform as well.

It isn’t really any different with our relationship with
Christ. If we fail to give our whole heart, then we often
find ourselves feeling as though something is missing in
our life. That is because it is. Maybe for the remainder of
the Lenten season you could try adding something to your
life. Set aside a few minutes every day for quiet time, and
seek God with your whole heart every day.

Through the Eyes of Peter Woodin
Gazing down over Oswego County at the churches he started, he is shaking his head. There's Hannibal Community Church merged with the Presbyterians and Fulton also joined them. Caughdenoy is a Methodist town. That church in California he has no idea what happened out there. Smiling, he looks down on the First Baptist Church of Central Square still a vital part of the community and is still on going. It was weathered its ups and downs ever since he built it and completed in June 1845. He remembers some of the parishioners, a relative of Marion Chesebro her grandfather gave the lumber to build the main church building which is still the same one today.

I have seen 30 pastors go through that front door over the years not to mention many interim Pastors. I have seen two Pastors serve twice they could not get enough of our little church.

There have been many changes to the church over the years mostly to improve on what we built. It still is a good looking building in the town.


I still wonder how many descendants are from the original group still attends and how many have we helped to find the way to god through our doors?
