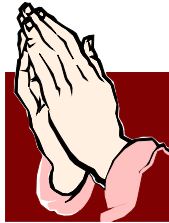

Roof Fund Appreciation

A number of you have, for some time now, contributed to a Parsonage Roof Fund. You will be pleased to know that your funds, combined with some additional ones, are now being used. The Trustees accepted a bid on Tuesday, October 9, 2012 and work has begun on the new roof. The old one had really been deteriorating, so this is really an important step for the Parsonage update. CHURCH ORGAN STATUS

We are sure you have noticed that our church organ has not been used very frequently. It has had serious problems with many of the keyboard and pedal notes staying in tune. We recently had it analyzed by a professional from Piano & Organ Center in Great Northern Mall. They told us that they believe it is a nearly 60 year old analog instrument and repairs could reach the 4 or 5 \$ figure repair cost. To replace that organ with a digital one looking nearly like the one we have would cost an estimated \$20,000. If we wanted one with a few more “bells & whistles” it would be \$30,000. Digital instruments cost far less to maintain.

Our organist, Victor Vrooman, is very comfortable and accomplished using a digital keyboard or piano and that both instruments would provide the “organ sound” many of us like or prefer. The cost range there is \$5,000 to \$8,000.

Now, we would like your input. Realize, also, that occasionally a guest organist may be required or requested. Additionally, the obvious question of “Where will the funds come from?” needs to be answered. Please contact Lynn Bort or any member of the Music Committee with suggestions, opinions, etc.



Parsonage Update

On Sunday, October 7, 2012, a Special Congregational Meeting was held immediately following Communion. The sole purpose of that meeting was to decide: (A) To accept the Purchase Offer withdrawal by the Central Square Fire Company for the Parsonage along with the anonymous donation of \$20,000 for parsonage needs or (B) To keep the original January vote in place to sell the Parsonage. A paper ballot was distributed to qualified voters and the vote results were 31 “Yes” and 3 “No” votes in favor of option (A).

We have been faced with a new situation since the January, 2012 vote. Our Pastor, Bud Adams, had a new calling as a Counselor with Harbor Lights in Mexico, NY. That left us with a new housing need for an Interim Pastor and, potentially, a new Pastoral Family.

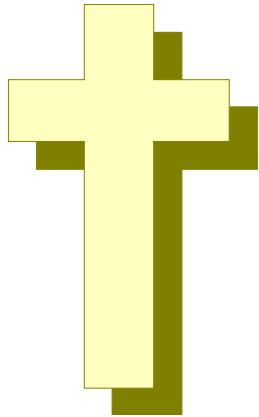
