### Baby Shower for Lizzy & Ryan

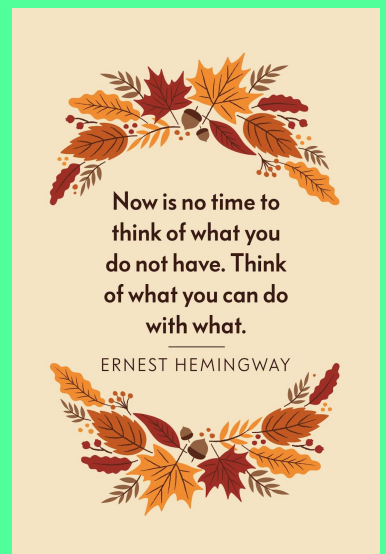
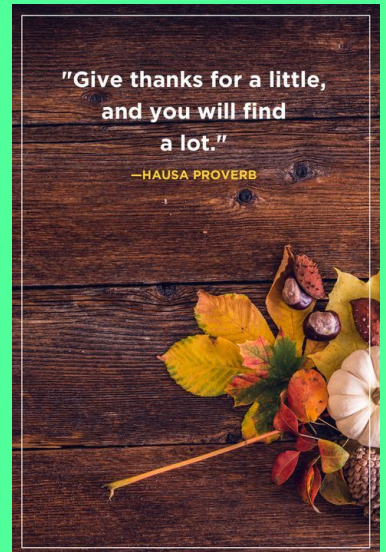
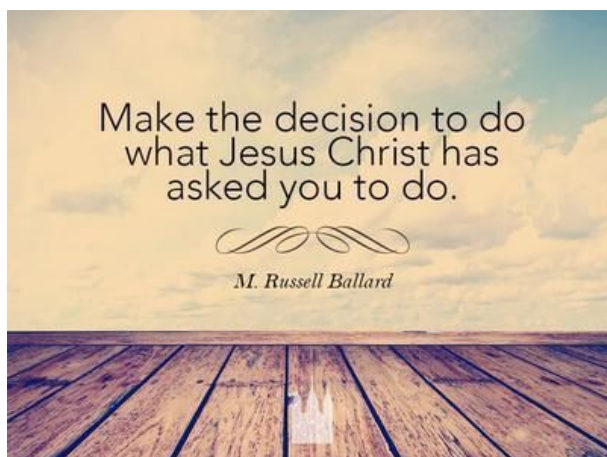

# The Pastor's Corner



Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice! Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near. Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by pray and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. Philippians 4:4-6

We've all spouted the words, "Where has the time gone?" We are about to turn the corner. The holidays are approaching very quickly. November is a month we think about thankfulness. And, preparing for the feast; the turkey, the stuffing, the mashed potatoes, cranberry sauce, pies and delicacies we all love to eat until we feel much like that stuffed turkey. Our former busyness will gradually build until we find ourselves at warp speed. December, Advent and Christmas follows with shouts of acclamation. Like the folks in Whoville, we hear them shout, "We are here! We are here! We are here!" At least that's what it's like in my world.

Writing this article has made me think about the things I am thankful for. The normal things automatically come to mind: my family, my friends, the roof over my head, the food in my belly, my church family and not the least is my special friend, Jesus. All good things to be thankful for.

We did an exercise in an AB Women's national board meeting one time and it was repeated at the state level. Person A asks a question to which person B answers but then it gets a little more intense when the next question is "why?" Six times person B is asked "Why?" Each time the question was answered, the answer came closer to the real convicted answer. So as I thought about it I asked myself - If I was to pick one thing that I was really thankful for, what would it be and why?

The thing I am most thankful for is the tough times I have gone through. Yep, you read it right the tough times. Each of us have experienced tough times. Times when we are broken; physically, mentally and spiritually. Times when we say, "Why God? What did I do to deserve this? Why me?" It's during those times that we become stronger versions of ourselves. It's during those times that Jesus is walking by our side, holding us up and keeping us safe. As long as you allow Him to. Sometimes we don't include Him in our troubles. We have the tendency to try and fix things on our own. We get so wrapped up in our own little world that we forget to lean on the one waiting for the invitation to come along side in our suffering.

I have quipped on occasion that bad food choices have made me the woman I am today. That's just the outside package; the physical. The tough times have molded and shaped me into the woman I am today spiritually and mentally. And for that I am forever thankful. What about you? What are you thankful for? Why? (Don't forget to invite Jesus into the conversation.) As you approach this season of Thanks-giving, spend time asking yourself those questions. Don't be anxious about anything; Jesus has your back.
