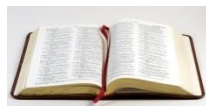

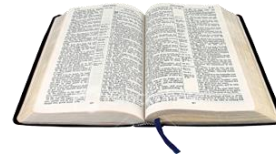

PASTOR'S CORNER



Fall has arrived, and hopefully it will stick around for a while. I am in no hurry for snow. It is nice to be back in a routine now that the kids have returned to school. I am, as most people are, a creature of habit. My calendar fills up quickly, but keeping busy is nice. What happens when the unexpected arises?

One thing I have learned is that ministry is never convenient, much like illness and death. It often seems like the moment we get comfortable or stop paying attention, the phone rings and our life is forever changed. What is our response when the unthinkable occurs?

When someone we love is hurting, our desire is to do something. We want to comfort, dampen the pain, and fix it! Sometimes there is nothing we need to do except practice the ministry of presence and be a stabilizing force in a time of crisis. We cannot always fix it with a casserole, and in certain circumstances the last thing a person wants to hear is that you are praying for them. Persons who are in the midst of the fire often say things without thinking, and do not realize how hurtful they are. If you are caring for someone in the midst of trial, you must also be sure to take care of yourself as well.

No matter where you are in your life, know that God searches you out. You are never alone; the spirit is closer than our own breath. If you need someone to be with you as you walk through the fire, all you need to do is ask. You are loved.
