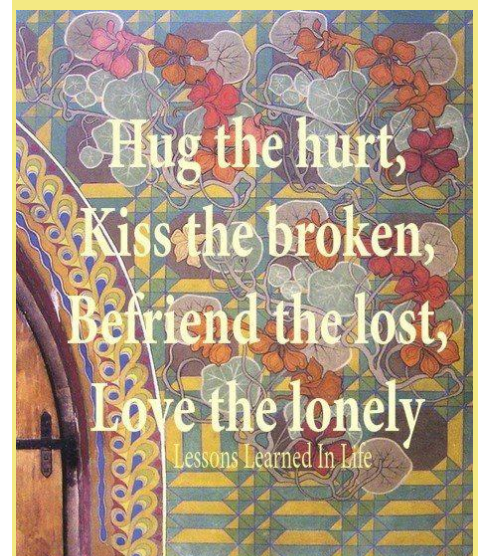
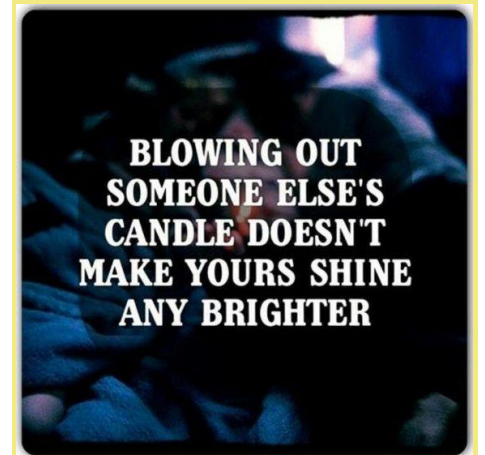
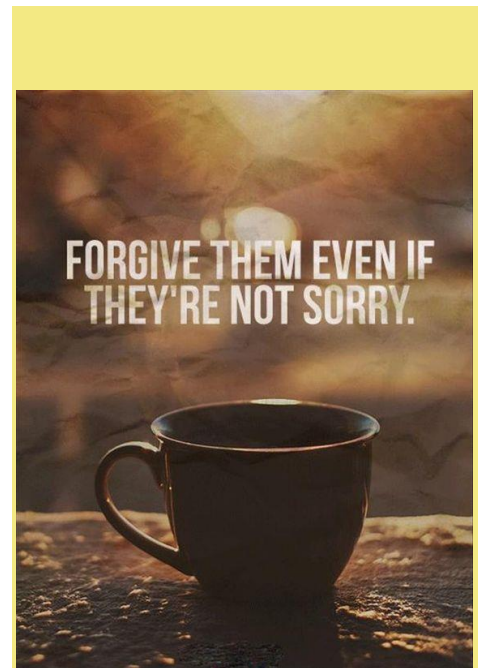

Third Sunday of January, annual meeting (January 15) after church, will postpone if needed.

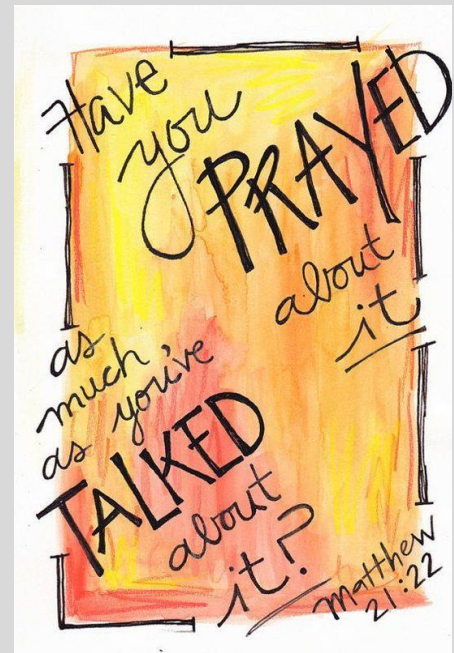

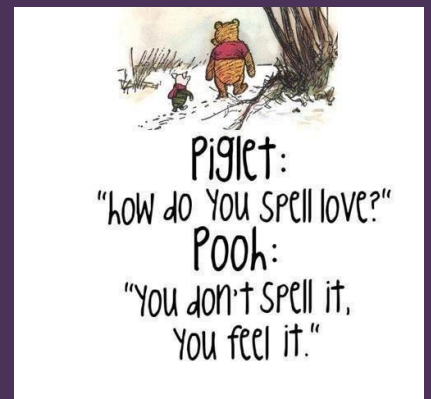


From The Reverend
