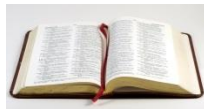

I strongly encourage you also to read the account of the announcement of Jesus. This is recorded in the gospel of Luke chapter one. “The virgin birth of Jesus is a critical part in God’s plan for our redemption. From the day we are born we are on a journey toward death and separation from God because of our sinful nature that has been brought on through Adam’s sin in the Garden of Eden (Romans 5:12). But through God’s immense love for us and his desire to have relationship with us, he sent his son, Jesus, to be born a virgin. Jesus was fully God, yet He was fully man. Jesus’ birth, death, and resurrection mean that when we acknowledge and accept the price Jesus paid for us, we will no longer live under the penalty of death.
