To Your Health



You may have been aware of the on-going debate over bisphenol-A (BPA), a plasticizer used in many polymer-based products to make them soft and pliable. The argument has been regarding the perceived health risks of ingesting this chemical.

Now researchers have linked behavioral abnormalities in children whose mothers were exposed to BPA during the first 16 weeks of pregnancy. [Earlier studies have determined BPA to be an “environmental estrogen”.]

Among the many sources of BPA – e.g., can lining, baby formula and bottles, dental fillings, plastic beverage and food containers – researchers were surprised to discover what they believe to be the greatest exposure risk: cash register and credit card receipts.

So if you’re pregnant or plan to become pregnant, handle those receipts as little as possible.

American Baptist International Ministries (IM) has been keeping us up-to-date with their direct relief efforts as well as the work being done by other agencies they partner with, such as IMA World Health, which provides health care services and supplies primarily in the developing world.

The details will change from day to day, and you can keep up by going to www.InternationalMinistries.org and typing **Haiti** in the search box. Among other things, you will learn that IM has already released **\$65,000** of One Great Hour of Sharing funds for Haiti relief and that Kristy Engle is leading a 75-person team of mostly medical people. And you will have access to the journals of our missionaries. Please take the time to read what they have written.

You can help in this effort right now by praying – by giving “Haiti Relief” money with your regular Sunday offering – by donating through IM’s web site – and by contributing funds for medicine / medical supplies through IMA World Health’s web site, IMAWorldHealth.org.

KINGDOM BOUND

The cost is \$85 per day for both the park and the Kingdom Bound event. Camping on site is an option, costing \$805 for the entire four days, which includes camper hook-up and six (6) tickets to the park and event.
