Do you need another reason to quit smoking? Is the danger of cancer not quite enough? Try this. The tobacco in cigarettes host hundreds of different types of bacteria and fungi, most of which belong to families that form spores – meaning they can survive in the dryness of cigarettes until they reach an environment that allows them to grow.

Among the most prevalent are germs that cause food poisoning, pneumonia, and serious staph infections. [By the way - - much of this research was conducted at Roswell Park Cancer Institute in Buffalo.]

Locked Doors

As you may know, our parking lot door is locked after our worship begins and a sign directing people to use the front entrance is put on the door. We all realize how much of an inconvenience that can be – especially when trying to manage an armload of children.

We have had incidents in the recent years where people have wandered into the back of our building while our congregation was in the sanctuary. Of much greater concern to us than the potential loss of property is the safety of our children and those who minister to our children.

We became very concerned for the safety of our children and the Children's Church volunteers. Although nothing harmful happened then, it doesn't take much imagination to realize the potential for real harm to be done, given the many instances of violent incidents at churches in recent times. We could very easily regret allowing such easy access to our classrooms and Fellowship Hall.

So, we have made it a practice to lock the parking lot and side entrances about 5 minutes after the beginning of our time of worship. Our Trustees discussed this practice again at their last meeting and will be looking into alternatives that would not compromise the safety of our most vulnerable members.

We hope you can appreciate our concern for the welfare of our children and volunteers. If you have any suggestions, please let us know.

We have two first aid kits. One is in the church **office right behind the paper cutter**, and one is in the kitchen **on the counter next to the stove**.
