ABC/NYS is putting together a mission trip to Haiti, led by Rev. John Buskey. The planned dates are February 19 – 26, 2011. The plan is to work on rebuilding a school in the Port-au-Prince area with ABC International Ministries missionary Deliris Carrión.

The cost of the trip is \$1,500 – \$1,600 per person with a \$500 deposit due by October 21. Anyone who would like to offer general support can do so by making a donation to ABC/NYS, with “Haiti Mission Trip” in the memo.

You will need a valid passport, money for a visa and any incidentals, as well as transportation to meet the team for a training event and transportation to the airport of departure. Immunizations and prophylaxis medicine will be also required for this trip. See Pastor Bud for more information.
