We also need to remind ourselves of this on an on-going basis, that our congregation cannot function effectively in pursuit of our mission, when our treasury is perilously low.

To Your Health



Do you think smoking among our young women is not a serious problem? Well, according to the Oswego County Community Health Assessment, 28.4% of Oswego County mothers smoked during pregnancy as compared to 13.7% state-wide and the lung cancer rate for Oswego County women was 50% higher than for the state. Broadening this to include males, nationwide, 17.9% of the adult population smoke, 18% of New Yorkers smoke, and 24.&% of Oswego County adults smoke.

We all are aware of the dangers that smoking brings to a person's physical health. And if you've ever been around a person whose life was being choked out of their body by lung cancer, you also now what it can do to a person's spiritual health.
