## To Your Health



Nearly 10% of parents are delaying vaccinations for their infants, nearly doubling in number since 2003. There are many reasons for this, including the proven false claim that links vaccinations to autism or other problems.

Whatever the reason, these infants have the time lengthened in which they are at risk for contracting preventable disease – diseases such as hepatitis B, diphtheria, tetanus, whooping cough, meningitis, pneumonia, polio and flu. In fact, recent outbreaks in measles and whooping cough, including 10 infant deaths, seem to be tied to this trend.

## ***SAFETY SLIDE LOCKS***

In June, our Board of Trustees were presented with a safety concern by those who operate our nursery. Chemicals for keeping the nursery area, including the rest room, sanitary are kept in the rest room. When children are in the nursery unattended, there is the danger that they may get into those chemicals. Further, kids being kids, they may decide to climb and reach up to pull items off the shelves.

The Trustees decided to install a slide lock on the top of the nursery room door, high enough so children cannot reach it. For the same reasons, they also installed a slide lock on the Utility Room door.

Please, if you open these doors, remember to slide the lock closed when you leave the room.
